

GET YOUR 2011 TAX CREDIT.

Federal tax credit allows homeowners to claim up to \$300 on their 2011 taxes.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act encourages homeowners to install energy-efficient residential water heaters. Homeowners who install any of our qualifying Eternal Hybrid models listed below can claim up to \$300 on their 2011 taxes. The tax credit is ONLY available for existing homes and must be installed in the taxpayer's principal residence.

There is an overall cap of \$500 for fiscal years 2006-2011 combined. If you have claimed this credit in the past, it counts toward the \$500 cap (but does not affect the \$1500 limit available for 2009 and 2010). Therefore, if you claimed \$300 in 2007, you can claim \$200 in 2011. If you claimed \$800 in 2009, you cannot claim any more credit.

To take advantage of the tax credit, follow the guidelines below and submit the 2011 IRS Tax Form 5695 with your taxes. For more information, visit www.energystar.gov/taxcredits.



HOW TO CLAIM YOUR TAX CREDIT FOR 2011:

1. Purchase and install a qualifying Eternal Hybrid water heater in your principle residence in the United States between Jan. 1, 2011 - Dec. 31, 2011.
2. Save your proof of purchase along with a copy of the 2011 Manufacturer's Certification Statement.
3. When filing your 2011 taxes, use the 2011 IRS Form 5695 and submit it with your 2011 taxes by April 15, 2012. On the 1040 Form the residential energy tax credit (from Form 5695) is claimed on line 52. Consult a tax professional for further details.
